

Tara M. Sinclair is a professor of economics and international affairs at the George Washington University, where she currently serves as chair of the Department of Economics and was formerly the director of the Center for Economic Research. A leading macroeconomist with expertise at the intersection of data, forecasting, and emerging technology, Professor Sinclair brings both rigorous academic scholarship and high-level policy experience to her work on artificial intelligence and the economy. She holds a PhD in Economics from Washington University in St. Louis.

From 2022 to 2024, Professor Sinclair served as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Macroeconomics at the U.S. Department of the Treasury, where part of her portfolio was research on the macroeconomic impacts of AI. Previously, Professor Sinclair was the first Chief Economist at Indeed, the world's largest job site, and founded the Indeed Hiring Lab, a research team that creates innovative data insights on the global labor market that inspire new conversations about the state of work. Her work has informed policymakers worldwide and has been featured in outlets including the *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, NPR, Bloomberg, and the *Financial Times*.

At GW, Professor Sinclair is actively integrating AI tools into research and preparing the next generation of economists for an increasingly AI-enabled world.
